Conroe Service League Scholarship Program

Eligible Areas: high schools, private, parochial or specialized schools in Montgomery County.

Application Distribution: Each participating high school Counselor's Office, CTE, and other specialized schools.

Payment: Directly to Student Financial Aid Office. STUDENTS MUST BE ENROLLED IN 12 SEMESTER HOURS AND ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR PROVIDING THE ADDRESS OF COLLEGE FINANCIAL AID OFFICE, AS WELL AS STUDENT IDENTIFICATION NUMBER, TO CONROE SERVICE LEAGUE BEFORE PAYMENT IS MADE. Photograph: Each applicant must furnish a photograph no larger than 2" x 3" with applicant's name on the back of the photograph.

References: Three letters of recommendation. One letter can be from a person who is not related to you (employer, church member) and two must be from a school employee.

Narrative: Each application must include a 500-word typed essay-double spaced-12 font. The narrative must address the topic:

"The Event That Had the Most Effect on My Life".

Documentation: Each application must be accompanied by an official transcript showing academic average and grading scale through four years of high school, official ranking of applicant, class size, proof of SAT/ACT scores, references and photo.

Evaluation: A selection committee comprised of Conroe Service League members will review all completed applications and personally interview applicants. A rating sheet will be used as part of the process, and each applicant will be scored individually.

Deadline: February 16, 2026. No late applications will be accepted.

Notification: Notice of interview times, as well as scholarship awards, will be sent via email.
